# BARCELONA

The 1992 Summer Olympics revealed to the world what Europeans and seasoned travelers already knew — Barcelona is one of the world's great treasures. Vibrant and earthy, commercial and cultural, this city of four million residents is the capital of Spain's autonomous region of Catalonia. Stroll along the wide, tree-lined promenades of Las Ramblas and marvel at the spires of Gaudi's cathedral La Sagrada Familia. Or visit the former Olympic Ring on the hill of Montjuic — also home to world-class parks, fountains and museums. Barcelona, which nurtured such artistic giants as Picasso, Dali, Miro and Casals, is a traveler's paradise.

## THINGS TO SEE AND DO IN AND AROUND BARCELONA

**Las Ramblas** – Barcelona's famed shopping district is alive and colorful with flower stalls and cafés.

**La Sagrada Familia** – Barcelona's great architect Antonio Gaudi designed the church in 1883. Unfinished after a century, the awe-inspiring building with its massive spires lacks completed walls and a roof.

**Barri Gotic** – The narrow streets of the city's old Gothic Quarter are home to historic buildings including Casa del' Ardacia, the Historic Archive, and King's Square, site of the former palace of the kings of Catalonia-Aragon.

**Cathedral of Barcelona** – At the heart of the Barri Gotic is the city's 600-year-old Gothic cathedral. The altar holds the crypt of St. Eulalia, to whom the cathedral is dedicated.

**Montserrat Benedictine Monastery Complex** – Nestled at the foot of eroded mountain crags, Montserrat was one of the great monastic complexes of the Middle Ages.

**Basilica of Montserrat** – The monastery's superb Romanesque basilica is home to the famed wood sculpture of Catalonia's patron saint — the Black Madonna of Montserrat.

**Mirador Del Alcalde** – The overlook crowns Montjuic hill, site of the 1992 Olympic Ring, parks, fountains and museums.

**Picasso Museum** – Located in the old Gothic Quarter (Barri Gotic), the museum boasts over 3,000 pieces by the great Spanish master.

## Art & History

### MONTSERRAT / BCN-C

Montserrat was one of the great monastic complexes of the Middle Ages, drawing monks, philosophers and artists from around Europe. Its Romanesque basilica is home to the Black Madonna, Catalonia's patron saint.

**WHAT YOU VISIT:** Basilica — the somber interior is renowned for the gilded wood sculpture of Catalonia's patron

saint La Moreneta — the Black Madonna of Montserrat **SHOPPING:** In Montserrat's Plaza **WHAT YOU SEE:** Vineyards and olive, almond and hazelnut orchards, eroded mountain crags — the town and monastery occupy a plateau some 2,300 feet above sea level **PHOTO STOP:** Benedictine Monastery Complex

## PICASSO MUSEUM & GAUDI'S LA PEDRERA / BCN-F

Experience the city's rich cultural legacy. Pablo Picasso once lived in Barcelona as a struggling art student. Tour the city's Picasso Museum and view its collection of paintings, drawings, engravings and ceramics. Then visit Gaudi's La Pedrera, famed for its undulating walls, Art Nouveau balconies and elaborate chimneys.

**WHAT YOU VISIT:** Picasso Museum — housed in the historic Palau Aguilar in the Gothic Quarter and La Pedrera — considered Gaudi's finest finished work **WHAT YOU SEE:** Barri Gotic — the historic Gothic Quarter and Passeig de Gracia — a wide boulevard lined with superb Art Nouveau buildings

## GAUDI'S TREASURES / BCN-I

## GIRONA & DALI MUSEUM IN FIGUERES / BCN-Q

Travel to the heart of Catalonia and the provincial capital of Girona. Explore the city on a walking tour that visits the Gothic cathedral and the old Jewish Quarter. View sacred objects from the Cathedral Treasury and see the Arab baths. Tour the Dalí museum in Figueres. Designed by Dalí, it displays both his art and his tomb.

# CADIZ (SEVILLE)

Mention Spain and the images that inevitably spring to mind are images of Andalusia — shadows falling across the bullring, the staccato rhythms of flamenco, the waft of orange blossoms from a Moorish garden. Cadiz is your gateway to this storied land and the city of Seville. Visit Seville's massive Alcazar fortress, modeled on the legendary Alhambra Palace of Grenada. See the city's cathedral, a 15th-century Gothic masterwork that boasts a Moorish patio, fountain and minaret. Seville is also the legendary home of Don Juan, Bizet's *Carmen* and Rossini's *Barber of Seville*.

## THINGS TO SEE AND DO IN AND AROUND CADIZ

**Cathedral of Seville** – The 15th-century Gothic cathedral is Europe's third largest. The Cathedral boasts a patio of orange trees with a Moorish style fountain and La Giralda tower — a minaret that is all that remains of the mosque that once stood on this site.

**Royal Alcazar** – Designed as a fortress in 913 A.D., the building was rebuilt as a royal palace by Christians. Its various rooms, patios and halls vary in architectural style from the Islamic to the Neoclassic.

**Santa Cruz Quarter** – The city's Santa Cruz district is famed for its maze of narrow streets, whitewashed buildings and tiled patios.

**Royal Andalusian School of Equestrian Art** – Housed in a 19th-century palace, the prestigious school boasts magnificent Andalusian horses and offers superb displays of the equestrian art of dressage.



**Town Hall** – Built in two stages — in 1779 and 1861 — the Town Hall is a textbook example of Neoclassical architecture. The façade is decorated with garlands, round moldings with reliefs of Phoenician coins and a balustrade roof with stone vases.

**Cadiz Archeological Museum** – The museum houses one of Spain's primary collections of Phoenician and Roman artifacts.

# CANNES

Movie stars, motor yachts, the crush of paparazzi on the Croisette – such are the images of Cannes and its legendary film festival. But this gracious city with its palm-lined boulevard dividing divine beaches from chic cafés and nightclubs is also your gateway to Monaco and Monte Carlo, Nice and St. Tropez. For centuries this former Roman camp – the Castrum de Canios – was nothing more than a sleepy port. Then in 1834, the British Lord Chancellor interrupted his travels to Italy to take shelter from a cholera outbreak. He fell in love with the stunning coast; built a villa and voila! Two centuries later, the town remains synonymous with glamour, luxury and a sybaritic lifestyle.

## THINGS TO SEE AND DO IN AND AROUND CANNES

**Old Monaco** – The narrow, twisting lanes and vaulted passageways of the old city are best explored by a walking tour. The picturesque buildings date to the 14th century.

**Royal Palace** – The Royal Palace faces the Place du Palais and still retains its medieval towers. An audio player narrates the palace's highlights as you tour the ornate state apartments, including the First Empire style Throne Room and the Chambre d'York.

**St. Nicholas Cathedral** – Built on the site of a 13th-century church, the cathedral holds the royal tombs of Princess Grace and Prince Rainier.

**Casino** – With its extravagant exterior and ornate interior, the Casino is Monte Carlo's crown jewel. Charles Garnier designed the casino in 1878.

**Nice** – The city sits in a natural amphitheater on the Baie de Anges. The narrow streets of the Old Town are also home to the famous flower market.

**St. Paul de Vence** – This well-preserved town's 16th and 17th century buildings are mostly occupied by artisan workshops, art shops and elegant boutiques.

**St. Tropez** – The old port's pink and tan houses glow in the sun and luxury yachts lay moored in the harbor in one of the most beautiful bays on the Mediterranean.

**Antibes** – Surrounded by fortified walls, the ancient town is home to a Romanesque cathedral and the Picasso Museum.

**Valluris** – A haven for artists, Vallauris was home to Picasso from 1947 until his death. Visit the National Picasso Museum, housed in Vallauris Castle, a 13th-century priory.

# CIVITAVECCHIA (ROME)

Your gateway to the Eternal City, Civitavecchia has served as Rome's seaport since the 13th century. The port has a long and venerable history. The emperor Trajan built a pleasure villa near the modern city, while Bernini and Michelangelo designed the harbor fortifications. Yet the Eternal City eternally beckons. The ancient capital of the Western World and the center of Christianity for nearly 2,000 years, Rome provides an inexhaustible feast. Visit the ruins of the Forum, view the splendors of the Sistine Chapel, or climb the Spanish Steps, once the heart of Rome's Bohemian Quarter.

## THINGS TO SEE AND DO IN AND AROUND CIVITAVECCHIA

**Colosseum** – Completed in 80 A.D., the circus was home to centuries of gladiatorial combats. Animals and apparatus were kept beneath the arena, and the floor could be flooded for naval combats.

**Roman Forum** – The Forum was the heart of the city in Republican and Imperial eras.

**Vatican City** – The spiritual and administrative center of Catholicism is also one of the smallest independent states in the world. The Vatican mints its own coins, prints its own stamps, and maintains its own army of Swiss Guards.

**St. Peter's Basilica** – The Basilica took more than 100 years to complete. The greatest figures of the Renaissance were employed in its creation, from Bramante and Bernini to Michelangelo and Raphael.

**Church of St. Peter's in Chains** – This basilica dates back to the Imperial Age. The *Mausoleo di Giulio II*, created by Michelangelo, is found at the end of the right aisle.

**Vatican Museum** – The Vatican's museum complex houses an impressive collection, embracing art of every epoch. Over 1,000 galleries boast what is arguably the greatest collection of art in the world.

**Sistine Chapel** – The gem in the Vatican Museum is this celebrated chapel, home to Michelangelo's frescoes *The Creation* and *The Last Judgment*.

**Trevi Fountain** – Blue-green water cascades over the Baroque figures of Rome's most famous fountain. Toss a coin into the fountain ensuring your return to the Eternal City.

**Spanish Steps** – The heart of Rome's old Bohemian Quarter (Keats and Shelley lived nearby), the steps are named for the 16th-century Spanish Embassy to the Holy See. Today, the area is a chic shopping district.

**Pantheon** – The Pantheon is one of the most influential works of architecture in Western history. The original temple was built in 27 B.C.; Hadrian added the enormous dome in 120 A.D.

**Piazza Navona** – This Baroque square is home to Bernini's Fountain of the Rivers (1601). The fountain features a central obelisk surrounded by allegorical figures representing the four rivers of the world.

**Tuscania** – Perched atop a rocky hill overlooking the Maremma region, this old Etruscan city dates to the 9th century B.C. Its buildings have been beautifully restored.

**Villa Borghese** – Built in the 16th century for Cardinal Scipione Borghese, the restored villa lies at the heart of the Borghese Garden. The villa is home to the Galleria Borghese, which boasts masterworks by Raphael, Titian, Caravaggio and Bernini.

# CORK (COBH)

Founded in the 6th century by St. Finbarr, Cork is your gateway to romantic Ireland. Stroll down narrow country lanes and see the Lakes of Killarney. **Palazzo Ducale** - The 16th century Palazzo Ducale or Doge's Palace was once the residences of the Doges, and later, housed the courts. After the 2004 European Capital of Culture designation, it was refurbished and now functions as a center for culture.

**The Old Harbor** - Genoa's aging harbor or Porto Antico was renovated into an exciting modernist harbor center of shops and eateries, designed by famed architect and native son Renzo Piano.

**Cattedrale di San Lorenzo** - This black-and-white striped marble cathedral has a unique feature in the chapel: a dropped bomb leftover from World War II that was dropped on the chapel but never detonated.

**Via Garibaldi** - This magnificent Genoese street is lined with marble palaces. It's a popular place for strolling and taking in the visual splendor.

**Milan** - Approximately an hour-and-a-half train ride from Genoa is Milan, the international business and fashion centers of the country. Milan's energy and high styling inhabitants are irresistible draws to this sprawling city.

**Portofino** - This luxury seaside resort, approximately 14 miles from Genoa, has some of the finest restaurants and hotels around. Its protected inlet with a lush tree-lined coast is an idyllic setting.

# GIBRALTAR

The Rock crouches over the sea like an ancient stone beast, looking Sphinx-like to Africa. Beneath the white cliffs of this natural fortress grow a profusion of palm, pine, and cypress. No fewer than 600 varieties of flowers grow here, some not found anywhere else on earth. Gibraltar's stunning setting is matched by its history — five countries have battled for 13 centuries to control the passage between the Atlantic and the Mediterranean. The result made for a cultural melting pot. Veiled Moroccan women in caftans and vacationing Englishmen and Spaniards stroll the narrow, steep lanes. The locals revert to a liquid Spanish when talking among themselves. And visitors to a 15th-century cathedral pass through a blue-tiled courtyard, once part of a 13th-century mosque.

## THINGS TO SEE AND DO IN AND AROUND GIBRALTAR

**St. Michael's Cave** – The underground chambers feature illuminated stalactites, an amphitheater, and an eerie subterranean breeze. Steps lead from one cavern to another, exiting at the top row of the amphitheater.

**Apes' Den** – This site is Gibraltar's most popular attraction — the colony of tailless monkeys known as Barbary apes. The monkeys have inhabited The Rock for centuries.

**Cable Car** – The cable car travels to the Top Station, located on the site of a World War II gun emplacement, for views of Africa, Spain and the dazzling Mediterranean.

**Great Siege Tunnels** – Take an approximately 45-minute guided walk through the 18th-century siege tunnels carved by the British out of solid limestone.

**A City Under Siege Exhibit** – The oldest British buildings on Gibraltar now house a special exhibit on life in Gibraltar during Spain's relentless attempts to reclaim The Rock by military siege.

**World War II Tunnels** – The Rock's WWII tunnels are the site of an exhibition featuring historic photographs and a complete tunnel map.

**Upper Galleries** – Enter the Upper Galleries at Princess Caroline's Battery and stroll down these siege tunnels, blasted through The Rock in 1782, to St. George Hall.

# LE HAVRE (PARIS/NORMANDY)

Perhaps no other place in France holds more associations for English-speaking visitors than Normandy. The historic Allied landings on D-Day — June 6, 1944 — live on in the memories of British and Americans alike. Nor has Le Havre forgotten the dark days of the war. The port was nearly completely destroyed during the Normandy campaign. Today, Le Havre is France's second-largest port and the gateway to Paris, "City of Light," the Norman countryside, and the historic landing beaches.

## THINGS TO SEE AND DO IN AND AROUND LE HAVRE

**Paris** – The City of Light is filled with unforgettable sights, from the Eiffel Tower to Notre Dame Cathedral and the Louvre.

**Louvre** – The former royal palace is one of the world's great museums with an unbelievable collection of masterworks from Da Vinci to Picasso.

**Versailles** – Louis XIV turned his father's hunting lodge into the most luxurious palace complexes ever built. The great Le Notre designed the formal gardens and fountains.

**Rouen** – The capital of the Haute Normandie, Rouen was one of the greatest cities in medieval France and boasts a superb gothic cathedral. The English burned Joan of Arc in the cathedral square in 1437.

**The Landing Sites** – The D-Day invasion beaches — Sword, Juno, Gold, Omaha and Utah — stretch west along the Norman coast from Caen toward Cherbourg.

**American Cemetery at Colleville-St. Laurent** – The beautiful cemetery is the final resting place for 10,000 U.S. soldiers.

**Place de la Concorde** – Flowers and chestnut trees surround this beautiful square — the scene of execution for thousands who perished during the terror of the French Revolution. Marie Antoinette and more than 1,000 other Frenchmen met their fate at the guillotine.

# LISBON

Draped across seven hills, Lisbon was once the center of a vast maritime empire that stretched from the west coast of Africa to the Spice Islands of the East Indies. Then, on November 1, 1755, a violent earthquake destroyed two-thirds of the city in the space of 10 minutes. Only the Alfama, the old Moorish quarter, survived. Today, Lisbon is a stately city of Neoclassical buildings and wide plazas. Eternally linked to the sea, Lisbon's magnificent harbor is spanned by the longest suspension bridge in Europe.

## THINGS TO SEE AND DO IN AND AROUND LISBON

**Jeronimos Monastery** – The 16th-century Manueline monastery commemorates the great Portuguese explorers who opened the East to European trade.

**Alfama** – The city's medieval Moorish district is a maze of narrow streets and houses decorated with superb tile work.

**Belem Tower** – The chalk-colored old fort sits on the banks of the Tagus.

**Rossio Square** – This bustling square sits in the heart of the Baixa, Lisbon's central shopping district.

**Sintra** – Set in the mountains, Sintra is one of Portugal's oldest cities. The hillsides are dotted with the manors and castles of feudal lords and monarchs. An 8th-century Moorish fortress overlooks the town.

**Cascais** – This small fishing village on the Bay of Cascais became a fashionable seaside resort with an interesting mixture of early 20th-century homes and modern buildings.

# LIVORNO (FLORENCE/PISA)

Livorno is the gateway to glorious Tuscany. Visit Florence — the cradle of the Renaissance — home to the Duomo, the Uffizi and the Ponte Vecchio. Here the Medici fostered a city-state whose cultural legacy is as great as classical Athens. Giants like Dante, Da Vinci, Michelangelo and Galileo infused the West with a new creative spirit. Then there is Pisa, Florence's rival for political power. Pisa, a brash, commercial seafaring town rivaled the great maritime powers of Venice and Genoa. The city was a leader in art and architecture second only to Florence.

## THINGS TO SEE AND DO IN AND AROUND LIVORNO

**Piazza Della Signoria** – The Piazza is home to the Palazzo Vecchio, the Renaissance town hall, and a copy of Michelangelo's *David*. The square was also the site of the 1497 *Bonfire of the Vanities* when Florentines cast their worldly goods into a bonfire.

**Church of Santa Croce** – Michelangelo, Machiavelli and Galileo are buried in this large Franciscan church which boasts one of the finest art collections in the city. The chapels adjacent to the altar are decorated with Giotto's frescoes of St. Francis and St. John.

**Ponte Vecchio** – The famous 14th-century covered bridge spans the Arno and is home to Florence's medieval gold and silver guilds.

**Field of Miracles** – Pisa's Campo dei Miracoli is home to the Duomo, Baptistery, Campo Santo, and of course, the campanile: the famous Leaning Tower.



**Uffizi Gallery** – The Uffizi is home to some greatest works of Western art including masterpieces by Botticelli, Giotto, Titian, Michelangelo and Da Vinci.

**Accademia** – Michelangelo's *David* is on display at the Academy of Fine Arts.

# OSLO

Forest-clad slopes plummet to an island-studded fjord. Welcome to Oslo, Scandinavia's oldest capital city. The commercial center of Norway, Oslo has been a major trading port for over a millennium. Its harbor is crowded with shipping that ranges from cruise ships to workaday shrimp boats. Though a relatively modest city in size — some 550,000 Norwegians call it home - Oslo is one of the largest capital cities in the world in terms of area. The hills and lakes of its outlying countryside are a paradise for lovers of winter sports. And the city itself boasts a sophisticated, yet cozy charm, with a blend of 19th- and 20th-century buildings, many decorated with woodcarvings and bright frescoes, and wide avenues dotted with public squares and parks.

## THINGS TO SEE AND DO IN AND AROUND OSLO

**City Hall** – The landmark Radhus is noted for its collection of important Norwegian art.

**Holmenkollen** – Perched high above Oslo, Holmenkollen is the cradle of Olympic ski jumping and the site of the 1956 Olympic competition.

**Vigeland Sculpture Park** – The park is home to the stone, iron and bronze sculptures by Gustav Vigeland. The sculptures depict a complete human life from birth to death.

**Viking Ship Museum** – Oslo's most famous attraction are three Viking long ships unearthed near the Oslofjord. The vessels date back to 800 or 900 A.D.

**Kon-Tiki Museum** – The museum exhibits the rafts used by Norwegian explorer Thor Heyerdahl to trace ancient routes of migration.

**Fram Museum** – Fridtjof Nansen explored the North Pole onboard the Fram while Roald Amundsen used the little vessel on his 1911 expedition to the South Pole.

**Open-Air Museum of Norway** – The museum features historic and traditional Norwegian buildings in a forest setting on the Bygdoy Peninsula.

And the many small villages and shops retain an otherworldly air and 18th-century charm.

**Crater Lakes** – The caldera of an extinct volcano holds two lakes – one blue, one green – separated by a narrow isthmus of lava.

# ROTTERDAM

The largest port in the world, Rotterdam is an intriguing mix of the old and the new. The city's lineage is ancient — Count Willem III granted city rights to the sleepy fishing village on the Rotte in 1328, yet much of the city dates from the six decades following the end of World War II. An important industrial center and a major European port, Rotterdam was among the first targets of the Nazi blitzkrieg against the West. On May 14, 1940, the German Luftwaffe firebombed the city; Rotterdam was gutted. The post-war years saw a slow rebuilding but by the early 1960s the maze of port facilities extended all the way to the North Sea. Today, this city of over half a million is the economic powerhouse, not just of the Netherlands but of Northern Europe.

## THINGS TO SEE AND DO IN AND AROUND ROTTERDAM

**The White House** - The highest building in Europe when completed in 1898, the White House was one of the few buildings to survive the 1940 bombing.

**Hofplein** - Today, the heart of Rotterdam is occupied by this district of glass and steel high-rise office buildings.

**Coolsingel** - Leading from the Hofplein, this boulevard is Rotterdam's chief commercial artery.

**Euromast** - Over 600-feet tall, this mast-like tower was built to honor the 1960 Floriade and boasts stunning views of the city.

**Erasmusbrug** - Nicknamed the "Swan," this single-pylon suspension bridge is one of the most graceful spans in the world.

**Gouda** - This charming 13th-century Dutch town is home to canals, windmills and one of the world's great cheeses.

**Van Gogh Museum** - The museum houses the world's largest collection of Van Gogh's paintings and traces the artist's life from his early years to his suicide in Arles, with an emphasis on Van Gogh's development into a great master.

**Lion Monument** - This massive monument on the Waterloo battlefield marks the spot where the Prince of Orange was wounded during the battle.



**Panorama Mesdag** - Created by Hendrik Willem Mesdag, this 19th-century painting is the oldest panorama still in its original site. Nearly 50-feet high and 400-feet long, the painting portrays the sea, dunes and seaside resort village of Scheveningen.

# VIGO

Vigo clings to the slope of Monte del Castro, overlooking a namesake bay so vast, it could shelter an entire fleet. The city's medieval heritage is seen in the narrow streets and granite houses of the Ribera del Berbes, the old fishermen's quarter. Vigo is also the gateway to Santiago de Compostela, the most venerated shrine in all Europe during the Middle Ages. Pilgrims from the four corners of Christendom flocked to the magnificent cathedral, built between the 12th and 13th centuries. The cathedral still draws thousands of daily visitors today.

## THINGS TO SEE AND DO IN AND AROUND VIGO

**Santiago de Compostela** – During the Middle Ages, Santiago de Compostela was one of the three chief sites of Christian pilgrimage – the other two being Rome and Jerusalem.

**Santiago Cathedral** – The 12th-century Romanesque church has all but vanished. The ornate Obradoiro façade dates from the 18th-century. The interior Tree of Jesus has been touched by so many over the centuries that indentations have been worn into the stone.

**Plaza del Obradoiro & Plaza de Platerias** – The Plazas del Obradoiro and Platerias are located at two of the four cardinal points of the cross-shaped cathedral.

# BRUSSELS/BRUGES

## (ZEEBRUGGE)

Zeebrugge is your gateway to Brussels. The capital of Belgium, Brussels is really two cities in one. Old Brussels is a city of superb Baroque architecture with ornate guildhalls, cobbled lanes and one of the finest squares in Europe. New Brussels is the modern city, the capital of the European Union, the home of NATO and the seat of the European Atomic Energy Community. It is a city of fascinating contrasts.

### THINGS TO SEE AND DO IN AND AROUND BRUSSELS

**Brussels** — Capital city of Belgium and capital of the European Union.

**Grand Place** — Brussels' central square is often acclaimed the most beautiful public plaza in Northern Europe.

**Atomium** — This giant monument of an iron molecule was built for the 1958 World Fair in Brussels.

**Bruges** — Cobble streets, centuries-old buildings and canals are hallmarks of this romantic medieval city.

**Ghent** — The city has played a large role in history as a site for mediation between warring powers. The Treaty of Ghent, for example, ended hostilities between the United States and Great Britain in the War of 1812.

**St. Bavo's Cathedral** — The cathedral is home to two major masterpieces of Western art.

**Lissewege** — Known as "the white village" for its chalked houses, Lissewege lies between Zeebrugge and Bruges. The large village church was built between 1230 and 1270 and boasts an unfinished spire that is over 150 feet high.

**Ter Doest Abbey** — This Cistercian Abbey was founded in 1275 and destroyed by the Protestant Gueze during the Reformation. Chief among the surviving buildings is one of the few extant Gothic barns in all Europe. There is also a small chapel built in the 17th century after the abbey's destruction.

**Castle of Male** — The Castle dating back to the 9th-century was used as a defense tower against the Vikings. Afterwards the wooden structure was replaced with stone and Male became the residence of the Counts of Flanders. Throughout history, the castle remained of great strategic importance in a much disputed region. The Castle has since been restored and has been a convent since 1954.

## EXCURSION TIMINGS

Departure times for each tour will be listed on the Shore Excursions Order Form, which you will receive onboard. These have been published according to information from our Agents, but are subject to change should the vessel's arrival time at any port be delayed, or the itinerary for any particular excursion be amended. Prior to arrival at each port-of-call, the departure times of each excursion will be confirmed in the Princess Patter. Please note that the time shown will be the time the last tour vehicle leaves the pier.

Passengers are requested to report to the specified departure location (either onboard ship or pierside) at the designated time, as delay on your part can interfere with the pleasure of your fellow passengers.

## EXCURSIONS WITH LIMITED PARTICIPATION

Shore Excursions may be purchased in advance of your cruise departure online or onboard ship on a first-come, first-served basis. Many of our excursions have limited participation and reservation forms will be processed in the order received. When excursions are fully subscribed, additional requests will be placed on a waiting list in the order received.

## PERSONAL POSSESSIONS

Coats, wraps, umbrellas, cameras, handbags, traveling bags and similar personal articles remain at all times throughout the tour under the passenger's custody and control. Be careful that you do not leave your possessions unattended at any time in the car or coach in which you are traveling.

## PRICES

The prices for Shore Excursions are in U.S. Dollars; are subject to change without notice; are per adult, per child or in some cases per vehicle. All quotations made include conveyance according to the itinerary and, where applicable, meals, refreshments, guides and entrance fees, unless otherwise stated. Children, other than infants in arms, will be charged full fare unless noted otherwise.

## SHOPPING

Where possible, time for shopping has been allowed within the framework of some excursions. However, excursions are not primarily designed for shopping, and time allowed for this purpose may be limited.

## REFUNDS

No refunds can be made on any ticket, coupon or voucher unless notice of cancellation is given before the closing date indicated on the booking form for the excursions involved. The times when bookings will close will be published onboard. In the event of any excursion being canceled for reasons beyond our control, a full refund will be made. However, should any excursion have to be abandoned through force majeure or difficulties en route, the best possible refund will be arranged according to the circumstances.

## TRANSPORTATION

Passengers should appreciate that standards of transport vary considerably throughout the world.

Air-conditioned coaches are not available in many areas, and in some, local buses are the best available. Cars or taxis are also used at some ports where coach or bus transportation is not available or limited. Where excursions are operated by car, four to eight passengers are allocated to each car. Passengers wishing to travel with friends should all leave the ship together, as this will help the Tour Staff to allocate them space in the same vehicle. For the comfort of all passengers, smoking is prohibited aboard the sightseeing vehicles.

## WITHDRAWAL OF TOURS

The Tour Operator reserves the right to withdraw any excursion through lack of demand and to make any alterations that they may deem advisable for the comfort of the passengers, bearing in mind the convenience and best interest of each group.
