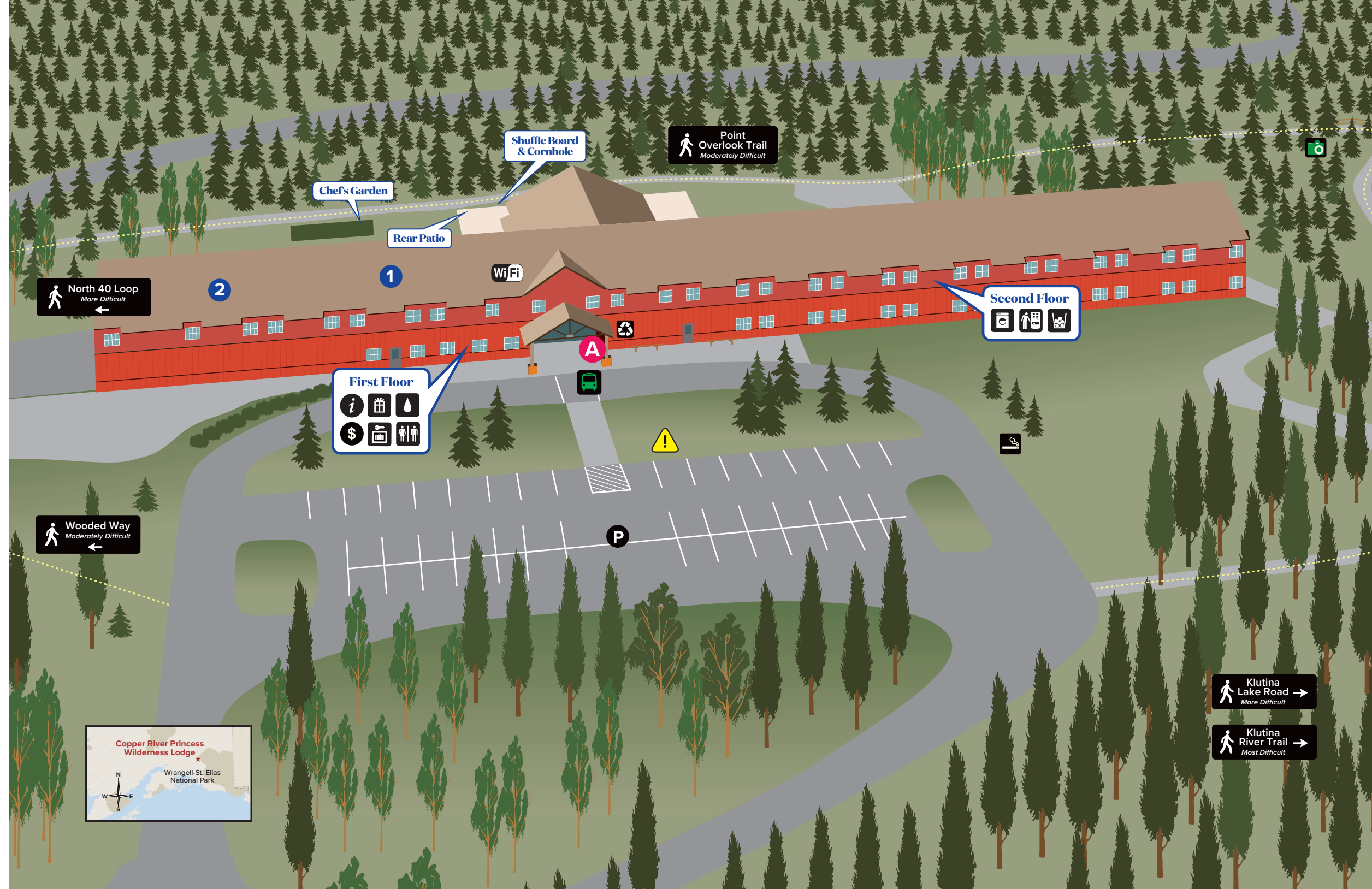

LODGE TRAILS

Wooded Way

0.1 mile one way, MODERATE

This short trail leads you through a section of woods where you'll find various Alaska wildflowers and plants. The trail ends at the Point Overlook Trail, leading to a bench and viewing point.

Point Overlook Trail

0.7 mile one way, MODERATE

Heading south from the back patio, this trail guides you past an authentic fishwheel and food cache. You'll also be able to view the Copper River Valley and Alaska Oil Pipeline through a pair of viewing binoculars.

Klutina Lake Road

0.25 mile one way, MORE DIFFICULT

Access this trail near the west end of the Point Overlook Trail. It continues along the bluff above the Klutina River to Klutina Lake, 26 miles away. Walk the overlook loop for a photo opportunity.

North 40 Loop

1.2 miles roundtrip, MORE DIFFICULT

Within the deep woods on this all-gravel trail, you will find yourself on an Alaska adventure.

Klutina River Trail

1.5 miles roundtrip, MOST DIFFICULT

Winding its way down the bluff from the lodge to the bank of the Klutina River, this trail is steep and uneven. Please be sure to wear sturdy footwear and check the trailhead sign for recent wildlife sightings. There are benches along the trail and at the river for resting, which are needed on the way back.

Wildlife safety

Located at the edge of the wilderness, our grounds often host local wildlife. To ensure a safe experience for both you and the animals, please follow these simple guidelines while enjoying the lodge surroundings.

Please inform Guest Services immediately of any wildlife sightings.

NEVER FEED or ENGAGE WITH WILDLIFE

Bear encounters

Bear/human encounters are rare and almost always have peaceful resolutions. The National and State Park Service advises the following behavior in order to avoid a negative encounter:

- Walk in groups and make noise.
- Avoid surprising a bear.
- Never approach a bear.
- If you see a bear, slowly backtrack from where you came. Never run from a bear nor turn your back towards it.
- Do not attract bears with food. Dispose of unwanted food in indoor trash receptacles or bear-proof trash containers.

Moose encounters

While moose may seem calm, they are wild animals that move surprisingly fast when they feel the need to protect their space. If you encounter one, please keep these guidelines in mind:

- Never feed moose.
- Give moose space. If the moose approaches you, give at least 50-foot distance.
- Charging moose: If its ears lay back or the hairs on its hump rise, it may charge. If a moose charges, get behind a tree.
- Never get between a cow and her calf.
