LODGE TRAILS

Creek Overlook 0.7 mi (1.2 km)

The paved roadway will highlight views of the Chulitna River and the running creek at the bottom of our northside gorge. Two boulders at the end of the trail make for a great picture.

Lodge Trail 0.4 mi (0.6 km)

An easy, meandering walk skirting the Chulitna River Valley, beginning at the Main Lodge or 20,320 Alaskan Grill.

South Loop Path 0.7 mi (1.2 km)

A partially paved pathway that passes a beautiful water feature and pond near building 23. A bypass shortens the distance if desired.

Treehouse Trail 1.1 mi (1.8 km)

The steepest grade of our walking paths offering great views of “The Great One” and the Chulitna River, ending at the Treehouse.



The Treehouse

Powered by solar panels, this 500-square-foot treehouse is the first of its kind designed and constructed in Alaska by Pete Nelson — star of the TV show *Treehouse Masters*. It boasts one of the highest north-facing viewing areas you can find on land. A naturalist is on hand throughout the day to answer questions.

Alaska Adventure Quest

Meet the Mountain Climber

Feel like you've stepped into a high-altitude base camp to hear firsthand accounts of "The Great One" from those who know it best. The event takes place in the Hudson Theater, named after Cliff Hudson, who loyally served the Talkeetna community for 50 years as a pilot. Be sure to stop by his restored 1939 Luscombe Silvaire bush plane used to transport climbers to and from basecamp.

Land excursions & tours

Just an hour from historic Talkeetna and its three mighty rivers, we offer a variety of ways to explore. Whether you prefer a relaxing scenic tour or a thrilling perspective from above, our excursions and tours help you make the most of your stay.

Here are a few of the experiences you can enjoy:

- Visit an Iditarod sled dog kennel.
- Hike and kayak through the Denali State Park backcountry.

Wildlife safety

Located in the wilderness, our grounds often host local wildlife. To ensure a safe experience for both you and the animals, please follow these simple guidelines while enjoying the lodge surroundings.

Please inform Guest Services immediately of any wildlife sightings.

NEVER FEED or ENGAGE WITH WILDLIFE

Bear encounters

Bear/human encounters are rare and almost always have peaceful resolutions. The National and State Park Service advises the following behavior in order to avoid a negative encounter:

- Walk in groups and make noise.
- Avoid surprising a bear.
- Never approach a bear.
- If you see a bear, slowly backtrack from where you came. Never run from a bear nor turn your back towards it.
- Do not attract bears with food. Dispose of unwanted food in indoor trash receptacles or bear-proof trash containers.

Moose encounters

While moose may seem calm, they are wild animals that move surprisingly fast when they feel the need to protect their space. If you encounter one, please keep these guidelines in mind:

- Never feed moose.
- Give moose space. If the moose approaches you, give at least 50-foot distance.
- Charging moose: If its ears lay back or the hairs on its hump rise, it may charge. If a moose charges, get behind a tree.
- Never get between a cow and her calf.
